The CAP meeting was held at the Dow House in Plaguemine.

Dave Wilson, Louisiana Operation's Responsible Care Leader, informed the group about current flaring. The flaring is the result of a 3 week turnaround that is nearing completion. Dave also shared with CAP members the processes being conducted at our new Poly D facility as we clear the lines to being start up.

LAO is on target to finish the year strong in safety and environmental with 12.9M Manhours logged on site. Dow's Julie Roussel received the MVP of EHS Committee at the Louisiana Chemical Association Annual meeting.

Wilson also gave the CAP members a brief update on activities conducted during the 3nd quarter pursuant to the cooperative agreement pertaining to implementation of groundwater remediation and reminded the CAP members that they receive copies of the quarterly summary of cooperative agreement activities in the mail.

Eduardo Do Val, LAO Site Director, announced his new assignment effective February 1st. He will be the Site Leader for the Dupont site in Orange, Texas. Kevin Cadien, currently the Site Leader at the Orange site will become the LAO Site Leader.

The company's first quarter results as DowDupont were positive. Sales, volume and price was up. EBITDA in operations increased. The focus remains on the merger regulations and splitting the company into three strong companies.

Stacey Chiasson Gautreau, Louisiana Public Affairs Leader, announced that LAO received Manufacturer of the Year by LABI. Dow's Zenille Saunders and Tommy Faucheux have been selected as Top 20 Industry Leaders under 40. And, a new class of PTEC interns has started their assignment at Dow, bringing our 2017 total to 36 PTEC interns.

Dow Ambassadors have visited every local high school and participated in Iberville's Career Connections event in order to recruit for apprentices. Another 15 apprentices are enrolled in

the program this year. Our Apprenticeship Program has become the first to be registered in Louisiana by the Workforce Commission and Department of Labor.

Dow volunteers have served 10,258 hours of service to our community so far this year and invested over \$1Million.
